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Kujawsko-Pomorska Online School

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Date: 16 March 2020 - 31 August 2020

Target audience: **402** primary and secondary schools from the kujawsko-pomorskie region.

Kujawsko-Pomorska Online School was brought to life as an anti-crisis project due to the Covid-19 lockdown.

The first e-classes were held on **16 March 2020** and were dedicated to the last-year primary school students and last-year secondary school students. The students participated in the Polish language, the English language, Maths online classes. Every e-class lasted 30 minutes and then there was a 15-minute interraction time between a teacher and students.





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The recording sessions were held in 2 studios at Kujawsko-Pomorskie Teacher Education Center, 36 Sienkiewicza Street in Toruń, Poland.

Apart from the Polish language, the English language, Maths or History e-classes, there were also online classes with psychologists, priests, PE teachers.

During the summer time, July-August 2020, the e-classes were recorded outdoors on the premises of numerous scientific and cultural institutions of the region.

Creative and devoted teachers eager to support students as well as organisational team stood behind the Online School project.









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The changeability of the general pandemic situation with regular classes, online classes, and hybrid classes proved that the Online School turned out to be a very accurate solution. Our region authorities decided to continue the project with the Kujawsko-Pomorskie Teacher Education Center advisors' commitment and teachers' commitment to support both the students and the teachers in this difficult time.

Between October 2020 and June 2021, the Kujawsko-Pomorskie Teacher Education Center continued the e-classes project.

We focused our efforts to improve teachers' skills. Teachers could participate in the course "Innovative Teachers of the Online School" . The teachers improved their oratory skills, self-presentation skills, copyright awareness and visual online material awareness.

To sum up, the project turned out to be an outstanding support for the students' education process, improved teachers' skills through participation as well as through the usage of the Online School contents. The project made a contribution to sustainable education effectiveness.
