After the welcoming by host in the Odisee University of Applied Sciences by **Jos Sterckx**, Senior researcher and project development of the Social Work Department of the previous mentioned University, **Annalisa Bisson**, Legal Representative of the ENSA Network and Director of the International Relations of the Veneto Region took the floor to open the ENSA general Assembly 2024.

Decision: the agenda was adopted

1. APPOINTMENT OF WORKING GROUPS LEADERS

Annalisa Bisson follows presenting the state of the art regarding the local coordination of the different ENSA working groups in order to confirm and appoint the relevant referees according to the members views.

- Older Adults working group: City of Rotterdam, referee: Anthony Polychronakis;
- Minors working group: Flemish Agency Opgroien (Growing Up), referee: Rudy de Cock, An Rommel;
- Youth and Family working group: Veneto Region, Direction Social Services, referee: *Pasquale Borsellino*;
- **ENSEL Network thematic working group:** Social cooperative Altera Vita (Cyclades Greece), referee: *Miltos Sakellariou*.
- Disability working group: Proposal for a new coordination by Generalitat Valenciana IVASS Valencia, referee María José Rico Llorca, Directora General Instituto Valenciano de Servicios Sociales, Maria Sorzano, European Project Manager.
- Note: the Conseil Départemental du Val de Marne was coordinating this group and their work has been highly appreciated. There has been a change in the management, the referee in charge is now working for the CCAS (Centre Communal d'Action Sociale Créteil). The <u>Generalitat Valenciana IVASS</u> <u>Valencia</u> is willing to take this role. This proposal has been supported by all the other working group leaders.

Decision: The above mentioned working groups leaders are confirmed and the candidature of the Generalitat Valenciana, IVASS Valencia as leader of ENSA Disability working group is approved

Words of thanking are expressed from IVASS Valencia by Maria Sorzano who is honoured of this role.

2. <u>NEW COMPOSITION OF ENSA WORKING GROUPS:</u>

Annalisa Bisson presented the proposal for the new composition of ENSA working groups:

- A. Working group Minors and working group Youth and Family will work together.
- **Themes including:** care, culture, education, youth employment, mental health, sports, family policies, violence prevention as leverage for child & youth wellbeing.
- Structure supporting the coordination: proposal shared by working group leaders to have a structure to support the coordination: with a core group with 1 chair or 2 co-chairs, 1 coordinator,

- members of the core group. Among the chairs or co-chairs proposal of The Region of Carinthia, *Christina Gaschler*, and Odisee University, *Jan Claeys*, *Jos Sterckx* for Coordination.
- B. Working group **Disability** and working group **Older Adults** will work together with their specific local leaders according to Older Adults and disability policies. Core group disability policies: among the proposals *Miljana Djanovic*, CCAS of Créteil and *Johan Warnez*, Cognition and Inclusion.
- C. Working group **Social & Emotional Learning:** the support to the coordination will be done by *Prof. Dr. Cigdem Sahin Taskin,* Canakkale Onsekiz Mart University, Faculty of Education (Turkey) and *Dr. Miguel Vidal González,* Spanish National Reference Centre CIPFP Misericordia, Valencia (Spain).

Decision: the new composition of ENSA working groups was adopted a core group will support the local leaders.

3. PROCEDURES FOR THE ENSA INVOLVEMENT IN EU PROJECTS

In order to have clear procedures for the involvement of ENSA in EU project the following proposals have been presented by the Veneto Region:

- Support letter: agreement needed of the ENSA-legal representative with advice from the Direction of Social Services of the Veneto Region & thematic WG coordinator;
- Associated partner: agreement needed of the ENSA- legal representative with advice from the Direction of Social Services of the Veneto Region & thematic WG coordinator;
- ENSA as full partner (PIC Veneto Region): agreement needed from the ENSA-legal representative
 with advice from the Direction of Social Services of the Veneto Region & thematic WG coordinator
 make unanimous advice;
- Full partner on behalf of ENSA (PIC by partner of ENSA): the ENSA-coordinator, with advice from the Direction of Social Services of the Veneto Region & thematic WG coordinator make an unanimous advise to the partner who will represent ENSA. All partnerships will be notified in the next ENSA GA;
- **ENSA as leader** (PIC Veneto Region): the ENSA-legal representative upon indications of the Direction of Social Services of the Veneto Region & thematic WG coordinator make unanimous advice;
- Advisory Board: agreement needed of the ENSA-legal representative, with advice from the
 Direction of Social Services & thematic WG coordinator. The name of the member of the AB can be
 suggested by the interested partner according to role and expectations.

Jos Sterckx from Odisee University thanked Annalisa Bisson and the Veneto Region for these proposals and expressed the wish for the ENSA network to keep, as much as possible, light procedures, Annalisa Bisson confirmed that the responses regarding agreements for the ENSA involvement from the Veneto Region will be very fast. Jos Sterckx adds that the Veneto Region, with its role as guide, should act according to what she considers is best for all and is grateful to the Veneto Region for its work.

Decision: the above mentioned procedures to decide on the involvement in projects are adopted

4. INTEGRATION OF THE YOUTH CARE PLATFORM IN ENSA

Decision: The Youth Care Platform has been integrated in the ENSA network. Members have been informed and invited to join ENSA.

6. NEXT GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The Municipality of Cava de' Tirreni (Province of Salerno) is candidate to organize and host the next General Assembly.

Decision: The proposal is accepted for 2024 or 2025 and the Municipality of Cava De Tirreni is thanked. The date has to be defined.

The Municipality is strategically located: 40 km from Naples- Capodichino airport with daily European flights, the nearest train station is Salerno only 7 km, and is well connected to the city's train station and to the Amalfi Coast which is only 3 km away. Cava De Tirreni leads the 13 municipalities of the Amalfi coast from Vietri till the Municipality of Positano.
