The Lombardy Region's role in supporting individual life projects for persons with disabilities

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Lombardy Region's actions in support of individual life project

- One of the first Italian region to approve a law which establishes the right to independent living (r.l. 25/2022)
 and support for family caregivers (r.l. 23/2022)
- Main areas of intervention:
 - o **Promotion of an integrated system of services** to reconnect existing offerings with the plans and lives of people with disabilities, including newly established **Independent Living Centers**, in order to implement the provisions of the newly enacted Italian disability reform (Legislative Decree 62/2024)
 - Strengthening of the coordination between social, healthcare and socio-healthcare interventions, even through updating requirements for Social Offer Units
 - Creation of autonomy pathways to facilitating the daily life of disabled individuals, thereby overcoming
 any barrier in their access to school, job market and accommodation, and valorization of the entire
 family starting from caregivers



Promotion of an integrated system of services

- The reform under Legislative Decree 62/2024 poses a challenge to the entire governance system as it represents a cultural change (marking the transition from an individual services approach vs the construction of a life project made up of economic and non-economic resources, both public and private), an organizational change (requiring a rethinking of governance) and strategic change
- The regional government resolution 4140/2025 provides the first operational guidelines for the two-year testing of the model launched in the province of Brescia (January 2025/December 2026), that will allow the development of the life project definition process and the project implementation model
- The model is based on a constant connection between social and health policies to guarantee integrated care pathways, involving and leveraging institutional and non-institutional resources
- A new ESF+ measure is being introduced to strengthen local disability services supporting this process



Updating requirements for Social Offer Units

The Lombardy Region is undertaking a **thorough review of its service network**, fostering a diversified, modular offering based on individualized planning of responses to changing needs and in respect of the individual's life cycle

Elements of innovation:

- Multidimensional assessment as a criterion for appropriate access
- Flexible organizational services for greater alignment with life paths and the introduction of flexible management models for individual and/or small group projects
- Connection with the local context maximizing the service network's ability to be a "resource" even for those
 who are not service users
- Integration with the social and health care network, based on modularity and continuity of services, including the possibility of providing health and social care services within the service network according on specific agreements



Creation of autonomy pathways

- School autonomy and facilitation of daily life: funding of Individual Plans for students with sensory disabilities, which include the provision of communication assistants and tools and technologies to promote student communication and participation; grants for the purchase of technologically advanced devices; funding for projects to promote LIS (Sign Language)
- Independent living: funding for projects that support independent living with a focus on personal assistance, home automation and social inclusion, as well as family emancipation (PRO.VI. (FNA), Dopo di Noi, PNRR, r.I. 25/2022 funds)
- Employment and social inclusion: alongside specific job placement tools (targeted placement), funding for social interventions addressing the prerequisites for accessing these tools (https://shorturl.at/5wD0B)
- Home maintenance: enhanced home care (monthly contributions for regularly employed staff and/or for the recognition of family caregiver care work) plus supplementary social interventions (socialization support, caregiver relief through training and emergency support, etc.)
- Contributions for the construction and renovation of inclusive playgrounds and promotion of accessible tourism in the Milan-Cortina area and in the provinces of Sondrio and Pavia (STAI 2)



Focus: call for proposals to foster employment and social inclusion of people with disabilities

First edition 2023-2025: **57 projects funded** for **€10.5 million** in grants awarded (ESF+ RP, ESO 4.8 action h.1)

Co-construction of the initiative through consultation with social partners

3066 recipients reached as of November 26, 2025, including people with uncertified disabilities, of whom 40.2% were women

1492 recipients (48.6%) over 25 years of age

1054 people were inactive at the start of the project (neither employed nor seeking employment)

196 recipients had other vulnerabilities in addition to their disability

A specific evaluation of training and employment outcomes will be launched

Second edition 2026-2029: **78 projects under evaluation** for **over €20 million** in grants requested
