- Competence development as a condition for citizenship
- Improved quality of care and social support

Actions

- Co-designed curricula between DPOs and training institutions
- Peer-led modules and capacity-building programs
- Efficient use of public funding with measurable impact
- Creation of new professional roles (peer experts)
